Meet your LA cluster

- Throughout your LA experience, you will be working in small clusters to collaborate, support, and share experiences.
- On your name plates, you'll see your fellow cluster member's names. Find your cluster members, sit together, and discuss the following questions:
 - 1. Why do you want to be a Learning Assistant?
 - 2. What do you think is the impact of peer mentor roles like Learning Assistants?
- Part of the role is engaging in conversations and meeting other students who you don't know. You are going to practice engaging in these conversations here in this space with your cluster and other LAs on the team. Sometimes this may be vulnerable, this prepares you for that moment with first-year students.
- No matter how we're doing whether things or going well or it's a tough time holding on to our purpose can be grounding. We're starting by talking about your purpose so it can guide your engagement and investment in our time together!

Discuss our training philosophy & practice

<u>Philosophy - what do we **value**?</u>

- We believe that training you to help students find belonging at K-State isn't taught through a one time "diversity" training. It's the core purpose of your role, so we integrate DEIB into everything we do in the LA program.
- We value providing intentional support while also challenging you to grow and thrive in the role.
- We value providing and receiving timely feedback.
- We value creating clear communication and structure for your experience.

Practice - what will we do?

- In our class sessions, you can expect us to introduce an idea and provide context, help you deepen your understanding of the topic through active and engaged activities, and allow you reflect on what we have learned.
- If you need to miss class for an excused circumstance (illness, death in the family, and other reasons that are verified through <u>Student Support and Accountability</u>), we ask that you communicate promptly so that we can connect you to a make-up opportunity. We do not allow absences for non-extenuating circumstances, and you will be released from the role if you miss class under those conditions.
- We minimize outside class work to essential tasks that can't be completed in this space. This semester, you can
 expect only three hours of outside class assignments.

Learn about the LA role umbrella

- We outline all expectations for the Learning Assistant role (such as all required class sessions, 1-//on-1s, and events) in the <u>LA syllabus</u>.
- The classroom part of Learning Assistant role is like an umbrella. Each classroom looks different, but we will give you the tools you need to make this decision and feel empowered to succeed. All LAs should be actively engaged in the class session by providing their perspectives and ideas for the students to hear; no LA should just be sitting in class not engaging in the discussion or activity.
- LAs may also teach one or two sessions of class or lead some activities if they are interested and
 discuss this with you. However, they should not be the primary facilitator, be teaching/leading
 more than three of the classes, designing the course syllabus, and they cannot grade any
 student work.
- These parameters are designed to ensure LAs remain firmly as a peer mentor, rather than either a fellow student or an instructor, in order to gain knowledge/education through this experience. We will train our Learning Assistants to understand this role definition, and would appreciate your support in reinforcing them.
- This semester, you will be meeting with your faculty member to set and document expectations for working together (on page 9 of the LA syllabus), which will include where you'd like your role to fall within this umbrella.
- As a former Learning Assistant for five different classes, Mia will share some examples of what her role has looked like in the classroom.
