

# Regents Assessment Conference


The Kansas Board of Regents and the Systemwide Council of Chief Academic Officers (SCOCAO) is pleased to sponsor the Regents Assessment Conference on the campus of Fort Hays State University. The conference is designed to serve as a starting point for a conversation on assessment of student learning outcomes and to provide more information on how assessment and performance agreements can complement one another.

The Regents Assessment Conference will bring together system wide experts and practitioners in the area of student learning assessment. Dr. Peter Ewell will join us to give insights on the need for effective student learning assessment in an age of accountability and performance agreements. In addition, we plan to have several "Best Practice" sessions that highlight the successes and failures in student learning assessment.



Cecelia Lopez has discussed the large gap between knowing about assessment and implementing assessment:

"After ten years of steady effort, the major lesson the Commission has learned from its Assessment Initiative is that it is not easy to gain universal acceptance of the efficacy of assessing student learning. This explains why it has been so difficult to have all NCA colleges and universities plan, introduce, and fully implement structured and on-going assessment programs—even over a ten-year period. Indeed, the number of institutions that have actually taken each of those



steps and are now using the results of assessment to develop and test ideas for how to improve the level of student learning in each academic program is still relatively small."

Lopez's words are as applicable today as when she stated them in 1999. This conference is but one means to close the gap between the need for and the practice of assessing student learning outcomes.

### Keynote Speaker - Dr. Peter Ewell



Peter Ewell has been a Senior Associate at the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems (NCHEMS) since 1981. His work at NCHEMS includes applied research on assessing institutional effectiveness and direct consulting with colleges, universities, and state and national governments on the collection and use of assessment and performance information in planning, evaluation, and budgeting. Dr. Ewell has also directed a series of grants and multi-institutional demonstration projects on the use of student-outcomes information in program planning and decision making, institutional effectiveness, and higher education quality assurance policy. He has consulted with colleges, universities,

and state systems in the areas of strategic planning, enrollment management, outcomes assessment, and program evaluation. His research and writing focuses on the topics of assessing college and university effectiveness, and on the use of information in decision making in higher education. Dr. Ewell has also developed tools for practicing administrators in enrollment management, outcomes assessment, and program review and evaluation.
