The Co-Chairs of Academic Affairs and our newly elected FS president, Teresa Douthit, are currently working through these proposals. There was a comment on one that was thought to have overlap, but it was discussed and the unit isn't opposing it.

9. Committee Reports

- A. CAPP (Committee on Academic Policies and Procedures) Kouba/Bilgili Kouba shared there was some discussion on the Inclement Weather Policy, and CAPP would like to hold it for further discussion in fall. Secondary majors were touched on as well.
- 10. Committee Appointments for 24-25
 - A. CAPP (Committee on Academic Policies and Procedures) -2^{nd} Wednesday monthly, 10:30 am: Bilgili and/or Kouba will attend these meetings.
 - B. Curriculog Team meets only as needed did not meet during 23-24

 If there is a need, Kelley and the team will reach out in the fall. Right now there is not much activity.
 - C. University Library Committee time will be set in fall once committee is appointed.

 Grant Alford was willing to continue, and the committee's consensus was to have him do so.
 - D. Undergraduate Grievance Committee members (names of volunteers will be provided for discussion prior to meeting). A motion was made and seconded to approve the recommended faculty members for the Undergraduate Grievance Committee. Motion carried.

- 11. Docket of potential committee work for next year.
 - A. Micro-credentialing University Handbook language (will hold off on changes until fall)

 This work on the handbook language will be brought back in the fall. Bennett noted again some wording related to "learners" but there will be some action in fall. Goos may be able to bring back some information about this.
 - B. Undergraduate Post Bacc minors in general future of these Brundage shared that she and her team worked with the student representative this past year and the intention was to present some information. That will be brought forward in the fall so productive discussions can occur and some decisions can be made.
- 12. Preference of format of AAC meetings for next year? Zoom / Hybrid / etc. Discussion but decision will be made in August.

Bennett shared that the last couple of years these meetings have been on Zoom, but it has been mentioned it may be desirable to perhaps have an in-person meeting a couple of times each semester. It was noted that flexibility is desired, but it can, at times, be a little more difficult for hybrid. However, some various locations were suggested that may help with this. A decision will be made in August.

- 13. Announcements and/or for the good of the University

 Bennett inquired about enrollment for the fall and Goos shared she believes overall we're up about 400 students. Transfer students is a little delayed, of course, but likely will be back up in the next year. Power BI is up as well, which was exciting news. Daily enrollment funnel is also up and running and appears to be accurate. Bennett also asked a department specific question, related to Math Pathways. Goos has that information and shared that 61% enrolled in new student orientation have enrolled for pathways.
