- 1) Kouba called the meeting to order.
- 2) Minutes from the November 5, 2024, meeting were approved as read.
- 3) Expedited Course Proposals:

Kouba updated the committee on items that were tabled from the last meeting. The Applied and Interdisciplinary Studies program from Olathe had questions about the 120-123 credit hours; several

marketing courses and Professional Strategic Selling (BSBA) had some questions. They are working on those and they should be on the next agenda.

Alford had questions about the Leadership courses on the current agenda. Birkhead and Gott spoke to the Gen Ed Council process and the split vote that had occurred, reporting that the Gen Ed Council had overrode the committee decision on the two LEAD courses and passed them, which moved them to this committee. Discussion ensued. Alford moved to table LEAD 212, 225, MANGT 220 and 230 to allow for further discussion and additional information. Discussion ensued. Motion failed.

McCoy asked that the rationale language be clarified on ART 325 and that the Impact report be updated since ID 225 and ENVD 201 are being added as prereqs, but the impact report doesn't reflect that. She also noted that all the music classes said they were going to remove prereqs, but it didn't list them in the rationale. McCoy moved to table ART 325 and ask for an updated Impact statement, in remaining consistent with the Academic Affairs Committee process. Kouba asked Susanne to contact the MUSIC course contacts and ask that they include the prereqs they are removing in the rationale. Motion passed to table ART 325.

After no further discussion it was moved and seconded to approve the rest of the Expedited courses. Alford abstained. Birkhead and Bentley voted no. The motion passed.

Kouba asked for a motion to approve the Standard course proposals.

Lyon asked for clarification as to whether ASMS 423 and ASMS 453, (Agricultural and Occupational Safety 1 and 2) were buildable or could be taken independently; is one a prereq for two? Jennifer Bormann joined the meeting and clarified that these could be taken out of order, 1 is not a prereq for 2.

Berney asked and Bilgili confirmed that the questions concerning COT 175 (previously tabled) had been answered and it was free to move forward.

Kouba asked about the age restriction prereqs on HM 440. Brundage said to leave it as is and the Registrar's office would work with the department to put a restriction on it.

Prakash asked about CSD 443 and 446, noting that the impact report from linguistics was not added. Fees responded that she had those emails and would upload them. Prakash pointed out that on the attached Course Change Form for CSD 446 there is a discrepancy in the primary component lecture default size – it says 9 in one location and 40 in another. Fees said she would address that. Prakash said she was fine moving it forward. Motion carried.

Kouba asked for a motion to approve all items in #5. Smith moved; McCoy seconded. Discussion followed.

Lyon asked for clarification on the impact statement in Biomanufacturing (Undergraduate Certificate). The statement mentions the departments that will be affected, but it didn't appear that they'd spoken with them. Berney said the Engineering Technology Management – Biomanufacturing course had the same issue.

Kouba pointed out that the Pesticide Safety and Data Visualization are non-credit microcredentials and are not supposed to be voted on by the committee.

Kouba said the College of Ag is requesting that we table the Agritourism course to give them a chance to meet up with the proposal originators and talk more thoroughly about what is expected from the Ag Econ courses. She made a motion to table the Agritourism course. Lyon asked if he could amend the current motion to include the Biomanufacturing course in Engineering as well as the Engineering Technology Management course. Motion carried.

With the exception of the microcredential programs, the previous motion to approve the remaining courses carried.
