## **BUSINESS MINOR**

Students can complete requirements for a business minor concurrent with completion of requirements for the B.S. in Hospitality Management. Following are the requirements for the business minor.

- To graduate in another K-State College.
- Complete the fifteen credit hours of business courses listed below. Students are responsible for meeting the prerequisites for each course.
- Students entering Kansas State University Fall 2011 or after must achieve a 2.50 cumulative GPA in the five courses that comprise the minor. (NOTE: the HMGMT degree requires a minimum of a 'C' in the five minor courses to meet its Professional Studies requirements.)
- At least three of the five business courses for the business minor must be taken at Kansas State University. The College of Business Administration determines application of any transfer courses within the minor. Consult the College of Business Administration before taking transfer courses to be applied in the minor.
- Obtain and complete a minor declaration form in Calvin 107.
