#### **Our Commitment:**

- This appointment is a nine month position for the 2025-2026 academic year and renewable for the 2026-2027 academic year contingent upon satisfactory performance
- The assistantship requires that you maintain full-time status as a graduate student (minimum of 6 credit hours)
- The stipend will be \$14,000 (\$700 biweekly) and requires approximately 20 hours of work per week
- In addition, you will receive an allowance of \$8,400 to assist in covering tuition and fees per year
