<i>Tenable</i> For graduate or professional school in the U.S. or abroad. Priority given to academic programs that clearly point toward a future career in public service.	
<i>Number &amp; Amount</i> Between 55-65 awards (including one per state ideally). \$30,000 maximum.	
<i>Duration</i> Two or three years. Duration depends upon the degree track. You can defer the Truman for up to four years automatically before entering graduate school.	
Eligibility	
<i>Who</i> US citizen or US national. Seek a career in public service. Upper quarter of class.	
WhenApply at campus level as a sophomore. Nominees then apply nationally as juniorsJuniors are defined as students in their penultimate year of undergraduate study.	
Selection CriteriaStrong record of public service/leadership. Government internships and activism a valued. Strong academic record. Aspire to be a <i>change agent</i> in the public sector. Interest in public policy and current events is important.	
Campus Deadline September 27, 2024	
<b>Deadline</b> We can nominate four candidates or more if there are transfer students.	
ApplicationApplicants complete K-State application first Form includes resume information and short essays. Policy proposal of 500 words or less. Transcripts. Three letters of reference (with specific instructions). Candidates interview at campus level . K State nominees receive campus endorsement and complete online application.

OtherTruman Scholars must attend a Leadership Week at William Jewell. Scholars can intern with government or nonprofit (Washington Summer Institute) in DC after graduation. Can also extend into year of employment (Truman Fellows Program).Scholars required to spend three of first seven years in public service after earning graduate degree (or the award turns into a loan).The foundation defines public service as employment in government at any level, uniformed services, public-interest organizations, nongovernmental research and/ educational organizations, public and private schools, and public service-oriented nonprofit organizations such as those whose primary purposes are to help needy or 	/or
