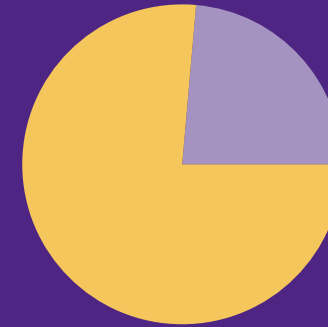

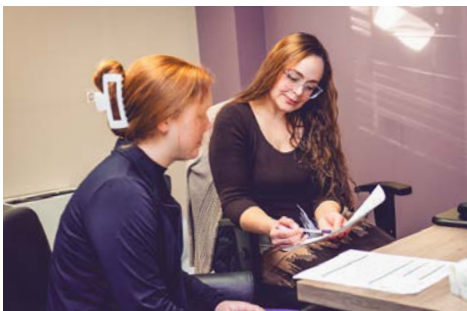

The Konza Prairie spans more than 8,000 acres and is home to many animals, including more than 250 bison.



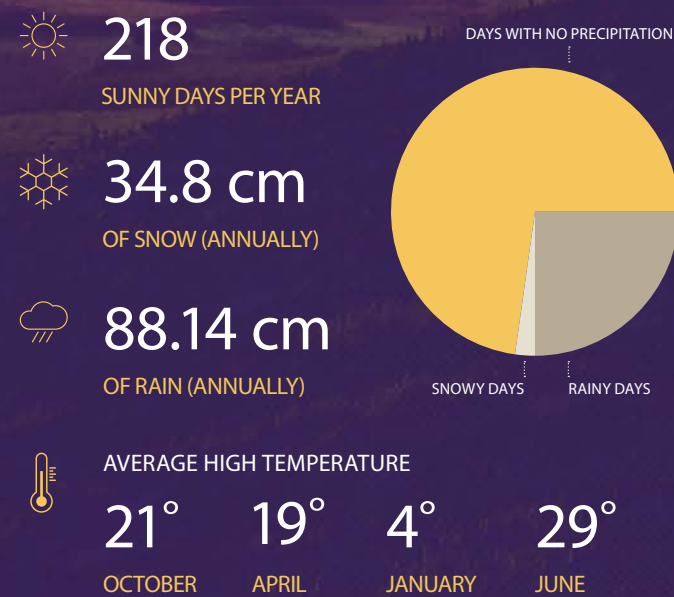

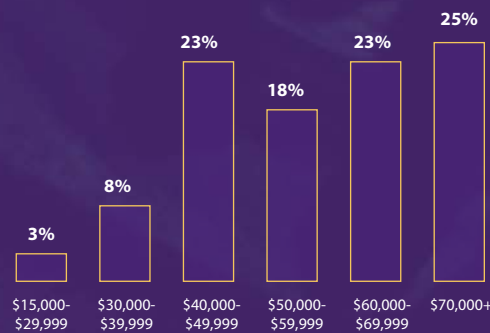

K-STATE SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

As the nation's first operational land-grant institution, we believe that every Wildcat should have the opportunity to pursue their educational goals, regardless of financial circumstances.

Undergraduate financial support

Awards are renewable for up to three years (four years, eight semesters total)* as long as you meet general renewal requirements. You may only earn one general university award.

Your eligibility for general university international scholarships/awards will be reviewed based on your application for admission. These scholarships are awarded based on merit.

* If you are enrolled in a five-year program in the College of Architecture, Planning & Design, you are able to renew awards for up to four additional years (five years, 10 semesters total). (five years, 10 semesters total).

Graduate student financial support

Various fellowships, scholarships and grants are available to provide financial support to graduate students beginning a program. These resources are also available during the course of the graduate program and as students near graduation and prepare for their professional careers. The Graduate School and other units at K-State offer financial support opportunities, and many other funding opportunities are available through external agencies and organizations.

Individual departments and graduate programs award graduate student financial assistance primarily in the form of teaching and research assistantships. They are awarded on a competitive basis. Research assistantships are typically funded through research grants or contracts awarded to the university. Other aid includes fellowships and internships to help support research and scholarship.

Last year, K-State awarded **more than \$254 million** in financial assistance.

Start your K-State undergraduate journey by following these simple steps. For purposes of admission, international applicants are defined as all persons who are not citizens or permanent residents of the United States.

- **Know the English proficiency requirements for your program**
Proof of English proficiency is not required for admission to most K-State undergraduate degree programs. However, a few selective programs have different standards. k-state.edu/english-proficiency

- **Reach your goals with K-State's accredited, award-winning English Language Program**
To prepare you for success, you will study in the English Language Program until you meet the English proficiency needed for your degree program. English classes through the ELP can count toward most K-State undergraduate degrees and you'll enjoy full access to the university resources and community while you study English. k-state.edu/elp

Freshmen: Secondary or high school GPA of 2.5+

Transfer: 2.0+ GPA on 24+ credit hours transfer coursework

GRADUATE ADMISSION

Start your K-State graduate journey by completing the online application for admission and uploading all required documents or media as requested and described below. Do not submit documents by email or mail to the Graduate School unless you receive a request.

Transcripts

Copies of your transcripts in English from each postsecondary education institution attended must be submitted. If you do not have copies of your transcripts, you will need to obtain copies for uploading. If your transcripts are not in English, upload translations in English.

Letters of recommendation

If requested, submit the name and email address for each requested reference. Each reference will be notified to complete a recommendation for you online.

English proficiency requirements

If your native language is not English, the Graduate School requires you to provide a satisfactory test score for Test of English as a Foreign Language, TOEFL; International English Language Testing System, IELTS; or Pearson Test of English, PTE. The one-semester Graduate Pathway course is available for qualified students to study English and begin graduate coursework.

Standardized tests (GRE, GMAT, etc.)

Some graduate programs require standardized tests, such as the GRE. You should request the testing service send your scores to Kansas State University, institution code 6334. If you indicated where you wanted your scores sent when you took the test, your scores were automatically sent. Standardized test scores are valid for five years.

Affidavit of Financial Support

Each application must indicate the source of financial support. Financial support documentation should be accompanied by the Affidavit of Financial Support form verifying that financial support is available for you while attending Kansas State University.

Submit application and application fee

You must pay the \$75 application fee to submit your application.

Priority dates

Deadlines in individual degree programs may be earlier, check with the department in which you are interested when planning your application.

- Spring (January) enrollment: **Aug. 1**
- Summer (June) enrollment: **Dec. 1**
